**Heroux Budget Conference Committee Priorities** 

Dear Chairman Dempsey,

I ask that during your deliberations that you consider these five requests:

### 1. Horizons for Homeless Children Playspace Program

7004-0101

Filed by Representative Paul Heroux #642 and Senator Linda Dorcena Forry #819 House allotment of \$75,000 and language in Consolidated Amendment E\*

• This program creates developmentally appropriate learning areas for children in 181 emergency shelters across the state to play, and trains volunteers to supervise the children.

## 2. Chapter 70 Funding Language

Adopt the Senate's amount of \$116 million and language regarding the local contribution and target contribution gap

"Minimum required local contribution for fiscal year 2017 shall be, for any municipality with a fiscal year 2017 preliminary contribution greater than its fiscal year 2017 target contribution, the preliminary local contribution reduced by 70 per cent of the gap between the preliminary local contribution and the target local contribution."

This change results in an increase in CH70 funding for Attleboro, \$35,659,451
