RE: H1371 An Act relative to the exposure of public safety officials to the aids virus DT: July 14, 2015

Dear Honorable Chairs and Members of the Joint Committee on Public Health,

Thank you for considering bill An Act relative to the exposure of public safety officials to the aids virus.

This bill has been filed on behalf of SEIU NAGE, The National Association of Government Employees. Its main focus is to impose legislation to inaugurate a HIV testing protocol in correctional institutions in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. It is all-important that the Commonwealth takes the health of our public safety officials seriously, and not in the least bit for granted. *H.1371 An Act relative to the exposure of public safety officials to the aids virus*, is a bill that will reinsure the security of public safety officials who may potentially be exposed to the aids virus via a person under criminal indictment, by establishing the right to petition the court having jurisdiction of testing the subject of indictment for the HLTV-III antibody or antigen.

H.1371 An Act relative to the exposure of public safety officials to the aids virus is legislation that provides public safety officials with the assured health rights to perform their day-to-day actives at the most effective level, all while keeping their health and their own safety protected.
